UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following  
O R D E R

1. The unsuccessful writ petitioner before the High Court of Bombay is before us. He is questioning a judgment and order dated 12<sup>th</sup> March, 2025, whereby his challenge to an order of suspension dated 18<sup>th</sup> April, 2024 issued by the respondent no.1-Tata Institute of Social Science<sup>1</sup> has been spurned.

Incidentally, *vide* the said order, TISS suspended the petitioner for two years.

2. Petitioner is a student of TISS, pursuing his PhD course since 2017. Owing to what TISS perceived as breach of its Code of Conduct by the petitioner, a show cause notice was issued. Petitioner's response was considered, leading to the impugned order for suspension.

3. We have heard Dr. S. Muralidhar, learned senior counsel for the petitioner and Mr. Rajeev K. Pandey, learned counsel for TISS.

4. Without examining the claims and counter-claims on merits, we feel that TISS having suspended the petitioner on 18<sup>th</sup> April, 2024 and lapsing of more than a year since then, interest of justice would be best served if the order of suspension is not continued further and he be permitted to pursue the PhD course in TISS. Ordered accordingly.

5. The petitioner, however, shall faithfully observe the Code of Conduct till such time he is a student of TISS. Should there be any further allegation of breach of such code, TISS shall be at liberty to proceed against the petitioner in accordance with law.

6. The special leave petition is, accordingly, disposed of.

7. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand closed.
